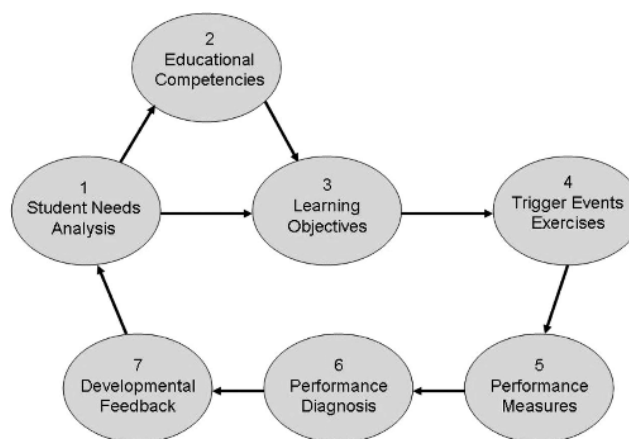


Figure 2: Simulation-Based Training
