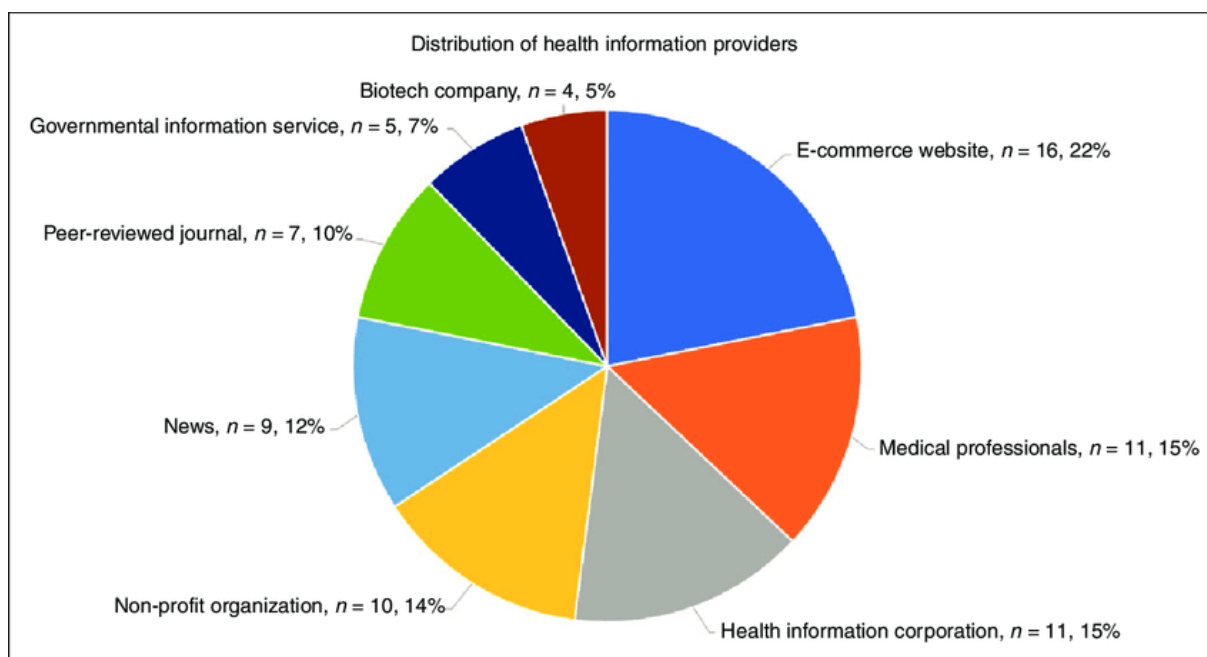


Figure 1: Safety Profile of Homeopathic Remedies in Children
