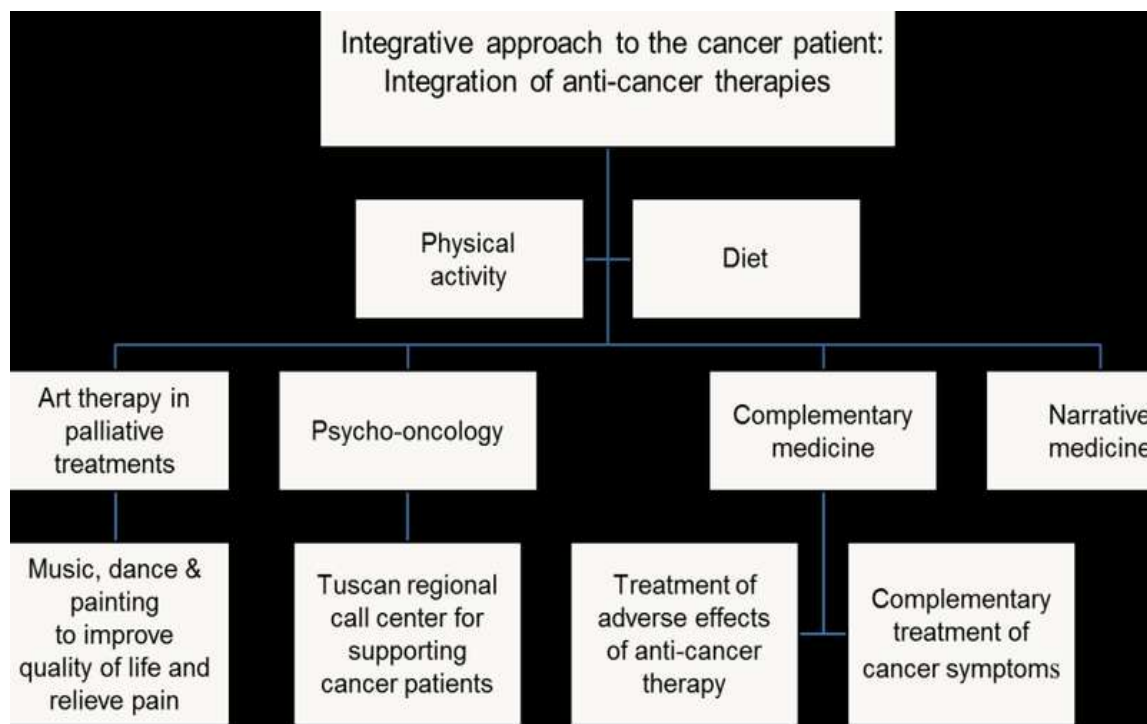


Figure 1: Diagram of Integrative Oncology Approach
